Current research

I am currently researching an early modern Hebrew translation of Josephus' *Contra Apionem* by Samuel Shullam (editio princeps, Constantinople, 1566) and preparing a critical edition, consisting of a transcription of the Hebrew text with English translation, and intertextual and linguistic commentary, for publication. This heavily biblicalised and rabbinised translation strategically departs from its source text to reflect the socio-political context and concerns of the Sephardic diaspora at the heart of the Ottoman Empire. It is thus an important witness, not only to the reception of Josephus among early modern Jewry, but to the modes of cultural negotiation, accommodation, and resistance of rabbinic Jews in Ottoman lands.
